

HISTORY OF THE PRESIDENT'S AWARD

Tom Meyer's started the President's Award when he was the Chapter President in 1993. He decided to set up this award to recognize an individual who is an up and coming member of the chapter (typically one that is not frequently recognized or previously awarded) that has gone above and beyond the average Colorado Chapter member's contribution. The wording on the plaque is "for exemplary and extraordinary achievement in support of the foundation and framework of the Colorado Chapter of the International Code Council."

Tom originally wanted this award to go to those that are newer "everyday heroes" that work hard to make the chapter a success. He felt that they are the ones that deserve some recognition yet are not at the point where the awards committee is ready to consider a Beryl Wallace award.

The award has gone through some transition when Dave Horras awarded the award to Dan Nickle. Dave felt that the award should go to the person that the president felt was a significant influence, assistance, mentor, etc. to the president.

The bottom line is that the President's Award should be given by the president for any reason as long as the recipient can demonstrate the traits of "exemplary and extraordinary achievement in support of the foundation and framework of the CCICC.
